#### Why intern at SHN?

- Know that your work positively affects project developments in and around communities where we live

#### What kind of work would I be doing?

- General planning assistance (research and review documentation pertinent to proposed projects, research zoning and land use designations, draft permit application responses, draft public notices)
- Report preparation assistance
- Preparation of figures and coordination with drafting, CAD, and GIS specialists
- Field data collection assistance
- Attendance at public meetings during which project applications are discussed

# What are SHN's minimum qualifications?

- Completion of coursework equivalent to "junior year" status of a Bachelor of Arts or Science degree in Planning, Environmental Science and Management, Geography, Land Use and Environmental Planning, or similar field from accredited university or college
- U.S. citizenship or authorization to work in the U.S. without sponsorship
- Valid California driver's license by hire date

# Are there preferred qualifications?

- Experience or coursework in environmental policy and law (CEQA/NEPA, CWA, ESA, etc.)
- Strong computer skills including the Microsoft Office suite
